Background

- Vivere is the primary beneficiary of the assessment. The results of the assessment will be shared by Vivere with SDC and with PVF.
- Most of our master documents are presented on www.vivere.ch
- Protection and assistance (including legal defense) to victims of human trafficking in two countries of exploitation and several countries of origin: thanks to SDC and to PVF our project has benefited from sufficient institutional funding since 2015, funding that will end in December 2019. Since 2004 more than 1'400 victims have validly been assisted, including safe repatriation to their homeland. The set of annual related expenses are cumulating approx. CHF 185'000. As soon as now we must find new donor-partner(s) to ensure continuation in 2020.

Objective

Our funding partners recently recommended that Vivere would gain for its own empowerment-building if an independent consultant runs an organizational capacity assessment. The capacity assessment is focused on Vivere as an organization, (not only on the subsidized project mentioned above). One of its main aims should be to make tangible & useful recommendations on how to position Vivere for the future,

including with regards to its capacity of raising funds for the project's needs in 2020 & following years. It needs also to look into how the ongoing action can/should evolve to systemic change in a strategic way.

The overall objective of this consultancy is to assess the organizational capacity of Vivere, and develop an action plan to master management in the following areas:

- Project Governance and Program Management
- Financial management and systems, including risk management
- Monitoring, evaluation (M & E), and impact -which fosters the need for a strategic direction.
- Procurement and Supply Chain Management (GAS)
- Structure of partnerships, and coordination of/with Vivere's acting partners in the concerned countries where Vivere is active.
- Communication how Vivere approaches donors and communicates the results of its work to them.
- Resource mobilization, (the consultant will make recommendations on ways to reinforce systemic
 outcomes of Vivere's projects in the different countries of intervention, while maintaining the
 very immediate and tangible impacts of its action for the primary beneficiaries whose life is
 endangered).

Scope

The scope of this mission includes the following aspects

- vision, leadership, partnerships, strategic plan
- the review of the current management structure of the association
- the review of the Vivere's different sources of funds
- projection of financial resources needed for the period 2020 2025
- the current positioning of Vivere and its fund-raising strategy
- recommendations to better define Vivere positioning to improve access to public and institutional funds.

Duties and Responsibilities

Under the overall supervision of Vivere's president, Mike Hoffman, the Consultant will be responsible

- To support Vivere with relevant knowledge resources and tools to implement a capacity development plan, including systemic changes when appropriate.
- To make a desk review of existing assessments and PVF or DDC assessments.
- To prepare a capacity assessment report and recommendations, including about systemic changes when appropriate
- To prepare a draft Capacity Development Plan with Action Plan and Budgets based on the participatory planning process including all Vivere's working domains
- To define a follow-up mechanism.
- To meet with or at least recommend possible new donors in Switzerland, and support Vivere in mobilizing resources.

Expected Deliverables in English

- a. A short report on the Self-assessment and Capacity Development planning process.
- b. Final Vivere's Capacity Development Plan, including fund raising prospects & targets, and systemic changes when appropriate.
- c. Re. the project Protection and assistance (including legal defense) to victims of human trafficking, the consultant will provide specific recommendations on ways to achieve systemic changes to reach the following goals
 - Reinforcing the legal ban of human trafficking
 - Reinforcing sanctions against any offender directly and indirectly involved in human trafficking
 - Enhance protection and assistance to the victims of human trafficking both in the countries where the victims are deported and in their countries of origin,
 - Prevention, by education and awareness raising of youth, orphans and other vulnerable groups, potentially threatened by human trafficking.
